- The scheme will boost economic activity associated with initial construction phase and through increased local patronage and footfall ensuring the ongoing vitality of the area.
- A significant proportion of Green Infrastructure helping to retain and enhance existing features. New landscaping features will
 offer habitat connectivity and thereby promote biodiversity species in the locality ensuring a minimum 10% Biodiversity Net
 Gain is achieved.
